## THE LEGAL STATUS OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION

- I have been requested by The South African Football Association ("SAFA") to let you have an opinion regarding the legal status of SAFA. In response to that request I have set out my views hereunder.
- The crisp question that arises from the request that has been made to me is whether SAFA is in law a separate legal entity notwithstanding the fact that it has not been incorporated as a company in terms of any statute.
- Hahlo's South African Company Law Through the Cases – Sixth Edition points out at page 7 that :-

"Leaving aside corporations of the public law, there are three ways in which an association of persons may acquire legal personality :

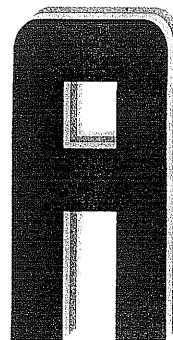
- (a) By special Act of Parliament, modern equivalent of the old charter. There are numerous corporations of this kind, usually of a semi-public character. Eskom (first incorporated by the Electricity Act 42 of 1922, currently in terms of the Eskom Act 40 of 1987) may serve as an example.
  - (b) By incorporation under a general enabling Act, such as the Companies Act 61 of 1973, the Co-Operatives Act 91 of 1981 and the Close Corporations Act 69 of 1984.
  - (c) By conducting itself as a juristic person : [4]. Since 31 December 1939, only an association of persons which does not carry on business for the purpose of gain can acquire legal personality in this manner; s 31."
4. The leading case on the application of these common law principles which give rise to juristic personality is *Morrison v Standard Building society* 1932 A.D 229.

The following extract from the judgement of Wessels J.A in Morrison's case at page 237 deals with this principle :-

"This particular building society has been in existence in the Transvaal since October 1891, under the name of the 'Transvaal Permanent Building and Investment Society'. It has been actively operating as a building society since 1891 and only its name was changed in 1929. Its funds amount to £726 559, and it holds property in all the provinces of the Union. The Society has brought many actions in its own name in the law courts. Even therefore if it has not obtained State sanction, it certainly has been allowed to carry on business in its corporate name, to hold property and to sue. It therefore falls under bodies without let or hindrance. This review of our law upon the subject has led me to the conclusion that Gregorowski J was right when he held in the case of *Committee of the Johannesburg Public [238] Library v Spence (1898) 5 Off Rep 84* that an association of individuals does not always require the special sanction of the State in order to enable it to hold property and to sue in its corporate name in our courts. In order to determine whether an association of individuals is a corporate body which can sue in its own name, the court has to consider the nature and objects of the association as well as its constitution, and if these show that it possesses the characteristics of a corporation or universitas then it can sue in its own name."

5. Thus, the present position in South African company law dealing with the acquisition of legal personality may be summarised as follows :-

- 5.1. an association of persons which does not carry on business for the purpose of gain can acquire legal personality by conducting itself as a juristic person if it does so in terms of a constitution that permits it to do so. This is known as the "realist" theory;

5.2. In all other cases an association of persons only acquires legal personality if it is incorporated in terms of a special Act of Parliament or in terms of a general enabling Act eg. The Companies Act 1973. This is known as the "concession" theory.

6

6.1. Having set out the legal principles it is necessary to determine whether as a matter of fact SAFA has acquired legal personality by conducting itself as a juristic person.

6.2. It appears from the information that has been given to me that SAFA is an association of persons which does not carry on business for the purposes of gain.

6.3. In addition, the Constitution of SAFA specifically provides that SAFA shall be a body with legal rights capable of suing and being sued and that no member shall have any right to its assets nor incur any liability for its obligations.


7. It follows from the foregoing that in my respectful opinion SAFA is, in accordance with common law principles, a separate entity having its own juristic personality.
