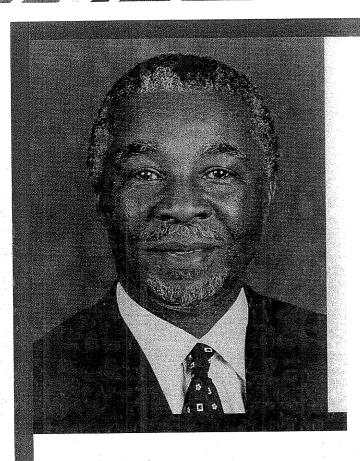

This is our ambition. The substance of this conviction is outlined in this document. I trust that you will find the contents encouraging and persuasive.

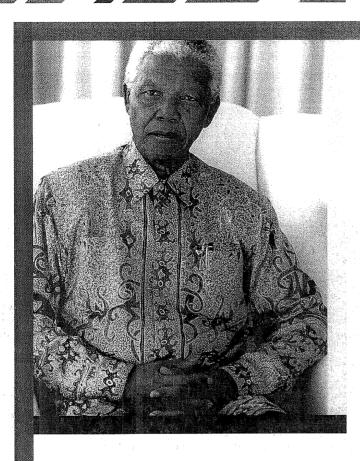

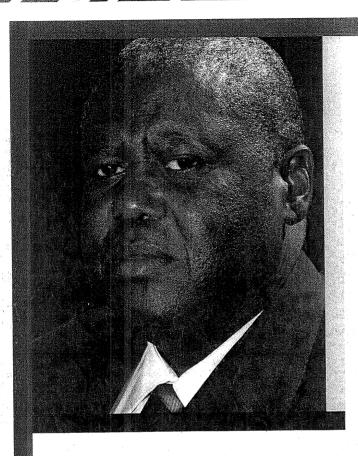

Yes, the FIFA World Cup™ will be wonderful for South Africa, but we believe South Africa will also be wonderful for FIFA's first African World Cup.

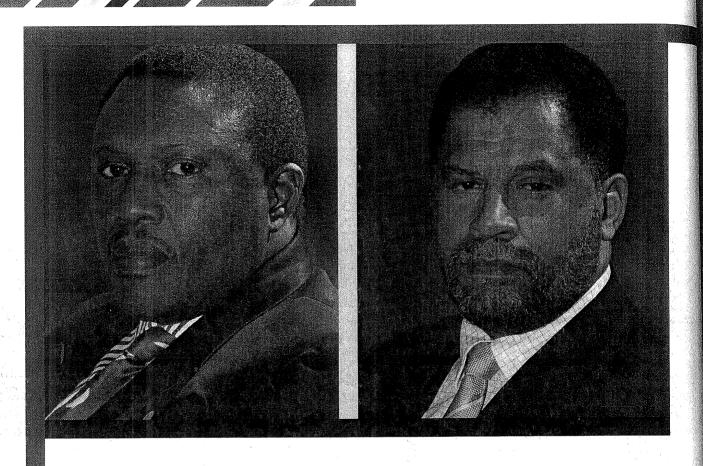

- Confirmed financial support and commitment from multinational corporations i.e.: Adidas, BMW, Philips, Vodacom (Vodafone), First National Bank (Mastercard), Anglo American (gold, diamond and platinum mining operations in 51 countries), SABMiller (second biggest brewer in the world), Telkom (telecommunications largest on African continent), Coca-Cola (a major partner of football in South Africa)
- Almost 80% of total sponsorship revenue of the African continent is generated within the borders of South Africa. We have developed a plan to present FIFA with a risk-free opportunity on African soil.
